

Example Trackside Induction

This is an example of briefing/site induction from a Sector Marshal for the specific location at the Australian Grand Prix.

The location and venue may change but the information can be adapted for other Sector Marshal briefings at other events.

- 1. Introduce yourself to the whole team
- 2. Read out, word for word, Safety Briefing and Site Induction notes
- 3. Key briefing points:
 - a. Key risk and control awareness
 - b. Positioning and vigilance
 - c. Unauthorised access control
 - d. Communication
 - e. Incident response and recovery protocols
 - f. Personal protective equipment
 - g. Issue/incident reporting and escalation
- 4. The Medical Centre is located ______5. Please note that the toilets and washing facilities are located
- 6. General Notes on Turn 3
- 7. Medical, any problems see me, this will remain confidential between us and the medical team at Turn 3
- 8. We're here to enjoy ourselves, although safety is paramount in all areas. Driver, officials, spectators. Watch for any possible problems, especially on race day
- 9. If the track is clean then sit and relax, especially Fire Marshals
- 10. Any time there is anything on track, be ready and alert
- 11. Do not lean on walls during track activity
- 12. Keep up-track of any openings
- 13. Spectator Marshals, there is a tendency for you to stand in groups. We need you to spread out and not concentrate too hard on the actual racing. Your job is to watch the spectators.
- 14. Anyone who is new to their role, or this is your first time trackside, see me now
- 15. Work together as a team, watch out for each other and have a good weekend of motorsport
