#### MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

##### Min 0376: DRIFTING – STANDING REGULATIONS

The Commission was advised that the task of writing up changes to the Standing Regulations is still work in progress.

##### MIN 0377: KHANACROSS REGULATIONS

It was reported that the sporting regulations were still being developed and that the draft revised Khanacross Code should be ready for issue in the next month in time for 1/1/19.

##### Min 0380: SAFETY REQUIREMENTS OF OPEN VEHICLES AT SPEED EVENTS

It was raised that the Commission needs to establish time-lines for any proposed system for the better management for open vehicles at Speed Events (as listed at Minute 0370 of the September 2018 meeting). Two factors for consideration are;

- improving safety for open vehicles by the potential addition of roll over protection; and
- to identify and address hazards to improve safety which needs attention at venues.

It was resolved to set up a teleconference between the Speed Working Group and the CAMS Technical Department to discuss in depth a potential way forward with the issue of roll over protection in Speed Events.

### **Min 0382: SPEED EVENT STANDING REGULATIONS – SUPERSPRINT STARTING REGULATIONS**

A Discussion Paper was tabled for the Commission to review Article 14 (d) of the CAMS Speed Event Standing Regulations and NCR 24B to assess if the regulations regarding starting a supersprint reflect the current requirements of club/multi-club competition.

The Speed Event Working Group are to determine if there is a need for shorter duration Sprint and Super Sprint events where multiple vehicles can be released; either two at a time or multiple under a safety car.

### **Min 0383: NATIONAL TOURING CODE (NTC) REGULATIONS**

Since the introduction of the NTC NSW has passed two State Bulletins as adjuncts to it and overcoming this situation is a key factor in the proposals presented to the Commission, which were approved for submission to the CAMS Board, to be effective 1/1/19.

The purpose of the changes are to:

- make the NTC an improved set of rules for clubs to work with; and
- provide a CAMS product that accurately reflects the needs of the clubs organisers these events

There have also been changes to the National Rally Code which have also impacted on the NTC (including the rebranding of TREs as Road Rallies).

### **Min 0384: MOTORKHANA TESTS BOOKLET**

The Motorkhana Tests Booklet (last publication was in 2013) is being upgraded, particular as regard the regulations contained therein. This will be available as from 1/1/19 from the website.

Any organiser using the 'old' booklet/s must note that the sporting regulations in the booklet are superseded.
